Experience a wide breadth of Central American wonders on this dynamic voyage that pairs an inland exploration of Costa Rica's Arenal Volcano Area with a maritime adventure through the Panama Canal to Portobelo and the Pearl Islands. Zipline through tropical rainforests, search for a panoply of wildlife on hikes and Zodiac cruises, visit two UNESCO World Heritage sites, and snorkel crystalline waters fringed by pristine beaches. Along the way, naturalists and local guides will illuminate each day's discoveries—from colonial history to local conservation initiatives.

Day by day

■ DAY 1

San José, Costa Rica / Arenal Volcano Area

Arrive in San José this afternoon and transfer to La Fortuna. This charming town in the northern highlands will be your base as you explore the surrounding areas and enjoy a sampling of Costa Rica's best wildlife areas and trails. Opt to arrive early for a pre-voyage wildlife and glamping extension in the rainforests and reserves of Caño Negro.

Arrival Time: Arrive before 1:00 p.m. local time.

Arrival City: San José, Costa Rica

◇ DAYS 2-4

Arenal Volcano Area

Spend the first few days exploring the natural beauty of the Arenal Volcano Area. Once considered Costa Rica's most active volcano, this cone-shaped wonder (which has been dormant since 2010) looms large over the verdant hillsides that surround it, providing a stunning backdrop to your activities.

Highlights include ziplining over dramatic views of the volcano, lush jungles and picturesque Lake Arenal; traversing suspension bridges for panoramic treetop vistas; searching for wildlife on the tropical forest floor; and taking a relaxing dip at the Ecotermas Hot Springs, which is heated by the natural energy surging from the nearby volcano.

Overnight at La Fortuna, and visit land nearby which was set aside to preserve the habitat for two- and three-toed sloths. More than 30 individuals of both species have been counted in the area. Your naturalists will share insights

about the flora and the other fauna, including toucans, agoutis, tree frogs and owls, which reside in this tropical rainforest. Lastly, marvel at the lush scenery of Pierella Ecological Gardens, a nature reserve and butterfly farm where iconic species like the Blue Morpho are sustainably raised on the property. On day 4, overnight at San Jose in preparation for the next day's activities.

◇ DAY 5

Panama City, Panama / Balboa / Embark Ship

Fly from San José to Panama City on our recommended group flight or on a flight selection of your own. Transfer by land to Balboa to embark the *National Geographic Quest*. Meet your expedition staff and marvel at the coastline ahead as you sail into the Gulf of Panama.

◇ DAY 6

Pearl Islands / Panama Canal Transit

Approximately 200 islands make up the idyllic Pearl Islands. Explore one of the islands in the archipelago as you learn about the history of the native populations, and eventually the Spaniard colonizers and African slaves, who arrived for the pearl trade. Deep rainforests, lush rivers, white sandy beaches, and shallow reefs provide a great backdrop for beach activities and snorkeling.

Later on, set sail for the Panama Canal. As cargo ships tend to pass through the canal during the day, crossing will most likely begin at night when the canal is dramatically lit. By special arrangement, *National Geographic Quest* will anchor overnight in Gatún Lake near the Barro

Colorado Nature Monument.

Meals included: breakfast, lunch, dinner

◇ DAY 7

Gatún Lake / Panama Canal Transit

This morning, you have a choice of two activities: Hiking and Zodiac cruising around Barro Colorado Island which is home to the Smithsonian Tropical Research Institute or a boat ride to Gamboa, where the Chagres River meets the Panama Canal, followed by a hike on the Panama Rainforest Discovery Center trails. This evening, continue through the complex lock system of the Canal as you sail to the historic port of Portobelo, on the shores of the Caribbean Sea.

◇ DAY 8

Portobelo

This morning, explore the Caribbean Sea on kayaks, stand-up paddleboards, or Zodiac cruises upriver. Portobelo is known for its Spanish colonial military architecture, which is designated collectively as a UNESCO World Heritage site. Visit several of the city's fortifications, as well as the old Customs House, and hear the tales of Portobelo's rich pirate history. Enjoy a traditional Congo music and dance performance.

In the evening, you'll remain in the bay of Portobelo to enjoy the sunset and recap the highlights of your expedition. Later, you'll set sail for Colón.

■ DAY 9

Colón / Disembark Ship / Panama City, Panama

After breakfast, disembark in Colón and transfer to the airport in Panama City for your flight home or

to the visitor center to begin a three-day Panama City extension.

***National Geographic Quest*, built in 2017, is designed for sailing into fast-moving channels and shallow coves in pan-American waters.**

When she rolled out of Nichols Brothers shipyard and into the bay on Whidbey Island, the 100 guest National Geographic Quest became the third ship in the Lindblad fleet built at this storied Pacific Northwest shipyard. In the 1970s, Nichols Brothers built the twin ships *National Geographic Sea Bird* and *National Geographic Sea Lion*, which continue to sail the waters of the west coast of North America and Central America.

National Geographic Quest was purpose-built to explore the fast-moving channels and narrow straits of Alaska, along the coast of Costa Rica and into the gray whale nursery lagoons of Baja, her design and engineering informed by our nearly 40 years of experience in these regions. Her twin boarding platforms, for example, were suggested by a veteran staffer. Enabling our team to load two Zodiacs at once means guests get off the ship quickly to take advantage of wildlife sightings and maximize exploring time.

National Geographic Quest's shallow draft allows her captain to navigate the same inner reaches and provide intimate "insider" experiences in these charismatic regions. Modern, clean-lined, with large expanses of glass to keep you connected to the extraordinary views, *National Geographic Quest* enables you to see, do and experience the best of her geographies.

MAIN DECK #301-306

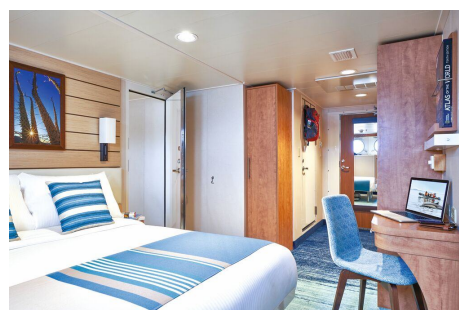
Cabins feature two single beds that can convert to a Queen, a writing desk, two nightstands and two portholes, full length mirror and reading lights.

UPPER DECK #207-229

Cabins feature two single beds that can convert to a Queen, a writing desk, closet, two nightstands, full-length mirror, reading lights, sliding glass door and a small, private balcony.

OBSERVATION DECK #101-108 (SUITE)

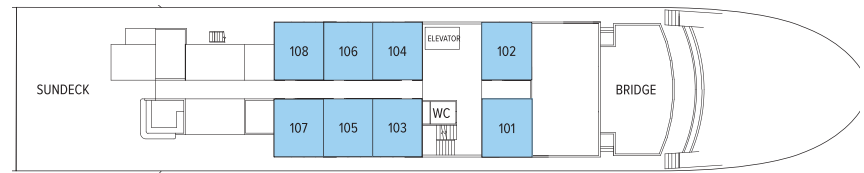

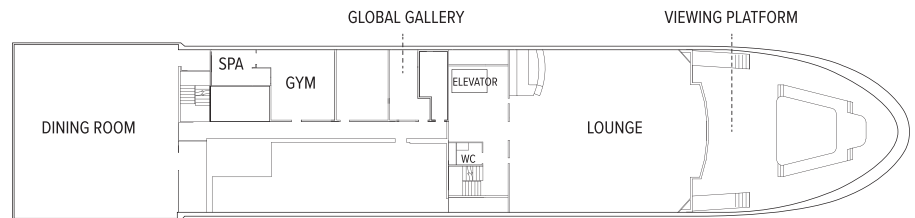

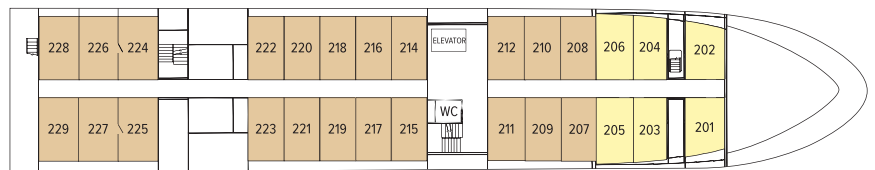
Lounge Deck

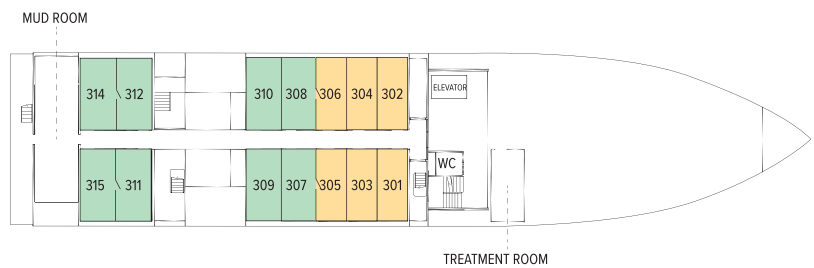

Public Areas

Reception; main dining area; global gallery; fitness center; lounge with full-service bar and state-of-the-art presentation facilities; observation deck; mudroom with lockers for expedition gear; partially-covered furnished sundeck; plus open access to the Bridge, the Captain, officers and on-duty wildlife spotters.

Meals

Meals are served in the dining room at a single seating with unassigned tables for an informal atmosphere and easy mingling. Menus feature sustainable choices, local where possible.

Cabins

50 outside cabins. All cabins face outside with windows, private bathroom, and climate controls. Cabins are equipped with Wi-Fi, phone, multiple electrical and USB outlets, and phones. Luxury linens and pillows. Botanically inspired shampoo, conditioner, shower gel, and lotion are all available in cabin bathrooms, as well as an Expedition Essential Kit. Hair dryers, complimentary insulated water bottles and a National Geographic Atlas are also available in each cabin.
